LAST BUT NOT LEAST Devotional from the Coordinator

A Gracious & Merciful God

In the book of Jonah we read about a prophet called by God, a pagan people and nation who end up responding to the mercies of God.

Nineveh, the capital of Assyria and infamous for its cruelty and great wickedness was Israel's enemy. Jonah, an Israelite, was to preach repentance to the Gentile Ninevites. Instead, he ran from God's calling - in the opposite direction. This is the only recorded instance of a prophet refusing God's Commission. As much as we try, we cannot run from God. He knows exactly where we are. But in spite of Jonah's reaction, God was able to accomplish what He wanted done.

It was not a coincidence or a fluke that a great storm arose. This was no natural storm. God appointed the storm, just as God appointed the casting of lots to fall on Jonah. Nothing was or is by chance. There are 10 appointed miracles by God in this small book.

In this account a great fish swallows and later vomits Jonah onto shore. In God's mercy, Jonah is given a second chance and willingly goes to Nineveh to preach. Nineveh repents due to God's preparation of their hearts prior to Jonah's preaching. How gracious our God is!!

The Ninevites worshipped Dagon, the fish-god considered to be half man and half fish. As for Jonah's success in Nineveh, Orientalist Henry Clay Trumbull made a valid point when he wrote;

"What better heralding, as a divinely sent messenger to Nineveh, could Jonah have had, than to be thrown up out of the mouth of a great fish, in the presence of witnesses, say on the coast of Phoenicia, where the fish-god was a favorite object of worship? Such an incident would have inevitably aroused the mercurial nature of Oriental observers, so that a multitude would be ready to follow the seemingly new avatar of the fish-god, proclaiming the

story of his uprising from the sea, as he went on his mission to the city where the fish-god had its very centre of worship." (H. Clay Trumbull, "Jonah in Nineveh." Journal of Biblical Literature, Vol. 2, No.1, 1892, p. 56).

Jonah would have been bleached white from the actions of the fish's digestive acids which would have been a great help to his cause. Can you imagine the sight? News travelled fast to Nineveh. This man who came out of the belly of their god would have caused a willing audience to pay attention to his words. We also know from history, prior to his preaching, there was an earthquake and a total eclipse. So when Jonah preached God's judgment message, the people's hearts were prepared by God through these appointed events.

God's love for the people of Nineveh, whom he had created, was far different from Jonah's indifference to their damnation. If God was willing to spare Sodom for 10 righteous people, how much more a city with approximately 600,000? And how much more our cities, nation, families? In His mercy and graciousness, God will use whatever it takes to awaken people to their sins.

Our daily prayer should be, "Do whatever it takes to bring them [our family, our neighbors, our town, our nation, our world] to You!" We must remember that no one is too far gone to be saved. In God's mercy He will do everything possible to turn a person towards Him. "God do whatever it takes to bring Revival. Begin with me. Revive us again!"

Christians in Revival by J.I. Packer says;

"Christians in Revival are accordingly found living in God's presence, attending to His Word, feeling acute concern about sin and righteousness, rejoicing in the assurance of Christ's Love and their own salvation, spontaneously constant in worship, and tirelessly active in witness and service, fueling these activities by praise and prayer."
